## FIVE PLAYERS MOVE INTO POSITION TO ADVANCE TO THE STARTERS ELECTION IN LATEST GOOGLE MLB ALL-STAR BALLOT UPDATE FOR AL AND NL

 Bellinger Continues to Pace Majors; Trout Leading American Leaguers;Santana, Chirinos in Top Three at First Base and Catcher, Respectively in AL; Braves Teammates Donaldson, Markakis in Position at Third Base and Outfield in NL; Grandal Jumps Two Spots to Join NL Leaders at Catcher;

Ten AL Clubs on Pace to Send Players to Starters Election;
Several Close Races Remain as Final Days of "The Primary" Approach; Voting During "The Primary" Available Until this Friday at 4:00 p.m. (ET)

First baseman Carlos Santana of the host Cleveland Indians, catcher Robinson Chirinos of the Houston Astros and Atlanta Braves teammates Josh Donaldson and Nick Markakis have all joined the leaders at their positions in the latest balloting update for the 2019 MLB All-Star Game presented by Mastercard. The balloting update for both the American League and National League was announced earlier today on MLB Network. The 2019 Google MLB All-Star Ballot, which is available exclusively online and via mobile devices at MLB.com, all 30 Club sites, the MLB At Bat and MLB Ballpark mobile apps and on Google Search (U.S. and Canada only) will be accessible until the "The Primary" voting period ends on Friday, June $21^{\text {st }}$ at 4:00 p.m. (ET).

In a bid for his first All-Star selection, Santana $(560,836)$ is closely followed for third place among AL first basemen by two-time All-Star José Abreu of the Chicago White Sox $(517,473)$, who was among the leaders at the position last week. Santana is joined at first base by fellow leaders and first-time All-Star hopefuls Luke Voit of the New York Yankees $(696,164)$ and C.J. Cron of
 the Minnesota Twins $(586,303)$. Behind the plate, Chirinos $(487,868)$ holds a slim lead over Jason Castro $(444,533)$ after overtaking the Twins backstop for third place at the position this week. Chirinos, vying for his first All-Star selection, is joined by 2017 All-Star Gary Sánchez of the Yankees $(1,357,340)$ and James McCann of the Chicago White Sox $(580,394)$.

A close race has emerged at shortstop in the AL with a pair of potential first-time All-Stars battling for the third position as Tim Anderson of the White Sox $(510,337)$ chases Gleyber Torres of the Yankees $(565,728)$ of the Yankees. Torres is joined among the AL shortstop leaders by Minnesota's Jorge Polanco $(818,082)$ and Houston's Carlos Correa $(656,995)$. Other highlights of the AL ballot include:

- Houston's Michael Brantley $(924,173)$ has moved ahead of Tampa Bay's Austin Meadows $(887,946)$ into third place among AL outfielders, trailing only overall AL leader Mike Trout of the Los Angeles Angels $(1,904,273)$ and Astros teammate George Springer $(1,495,817)$. All four players remain on pace to advance to the Starters Election along with fellow AL outfielders Mookie Betts of the Boston Red Sox ( 777,642 ), Eddie Rosario of the Twins $(687,515)$, Aaron Judge of the Yankees $(577,640)$, Joey Gallo of the Texas Rangers $(537,934)$ and Houston's Josh Reddick $(511,903)$. Twins teammates Max Kepler $(435,789)$ and Byron Buxton $(418,287)$ remain in contention as they try to move into the top nine at outfield in the final days of voting during "The Primary."
- At third base, the fourth-ranked Rafael Devers of the Red Sox $(335,635)$ is trying to chase down Hunter Dozier of the Kansas City Royals $(424,028)$ and Gio Urshela of the Yankees $(502,614)$ behind positional leader Alex Bregman of the Astros $(1,322,935)$.
- At second base, Tommy La Stella of the Angels $(1,020,912)$, Jose Altuve of the Astros $(923,117)$ and DJ LeMahieu of the Yankees ( 739,074 ) remain on pace to advance, outdrawing Minnesota's Jonathan Schoop $(362,504)$ and Kansas City's Whit Merrifield $(247,903)$.
- At designated hitter, Boston's J.D. Martinez $(893,689)$, Hunter Pence of the Rangers $(602,766)$ and Minnesota's Nelson Cruz $(506,211)$ continue to lead with Shohei Ohtani of the Angels $(362,947)$ and Aledmys Díaz of the Astros 9353,015 ) within striking distance.

In the NL, three-time All-Star Donaldson $(550,947)$ has overtaken 2017 All-Star Justin Turner of the Los Angeles Dodgers $(512,237)$ for third place at the hot corner to join fellow leaders Nolan Arenado of the Colorado Rockies $(1,475,825)$ and Kris Bryant of the Chicago Cubs $(850,758)$. Washington's Anthony Rendon $(378,761)$ remains close behind in fifth place at the position.

Donaldson's teammate Markakis $(614,358)$ jumped from $11^{\text {th }}$ place to sixth place among NL outfielders to join the leaders on pace to advance to the Starters Election. In the tightest NL race, Philadelphia Phillies outfielder and six-time AllStar Bryce Harper $(498,100)$ remains in $10^{\text {th }}$ place, closely behind Charlie Blackmon of the Rockies $(530,342)$, and within 100,000 votes of the final three outfielders in the top nine, which also includes Joc Pederson of the Dodgers $(598,909)$ and Kyle Schwarber of the Cubs $(585,997)$. NL MVP favorites Cody Bellinger of the Dodgers $(2,184,251)$ and Christian Yelich of the Milwaukee Brewers $(2,065,382)$ remain the top two vote-getters in all of Baseball as the rest of the top nine in the NL outfield includes Ronald Acuña Jr. of the Atlanta Braves $(1,229,200)$, Albert Almora of the Cubs $(645,291)$ and Jason Heyward of the Cubs $(614,823)$.

Behind the plate in the NL, Brewers backstop Yasmani Grandal $(513,412)$ moved from fifth place to third place over the last week, jumping ahead of Yadier Molina of the Cardinals $(375,690)$ and Philadelphia's J.T. Realmuto $(438,390)$, to join Chicago's Willson Contreras $(1,555,490)$ and Atlanta's Brian McCann $(725,484)$ in the top three. Other highlights of the NL ballot include:

- In a closely contested race at shortstop, Colorado's Trevor Story $(457,159)$ is closing in on injured Dodgers shortstop Corey Seager $(494,546)$ for third place at the position, behind Javier Báez of the Cubs $(1,672,062)$ and Atlanta's Dansby Swanson $(764,663)$.
- A trio of second basemen - including Kiké Hernández of the Dodgers $(455,704)$, César Hernández of the Phillies $(424,379)$ and Daniel Descalso of the Cubs $(410,122)$ - are trying to track down Ketel Marte of the Arizona Diamondbacks $(554,524)$ for third place at the position behind Atlanta's Ozzie Albies $(1,011,132)$ and Milwaukee's Mike Moustakas $(966,391)$.
- At first base, Josh Bell of the Pittsburgh Pirates $(1,106,186)$, Freddie Freeman of the Braves $(1,022,535)$ and Anthony Rizzo of the Cubs $(948,047)$ remain on pace to advance to the Starters Election ahead of Max Muncy of the Dodgers $(446,704)$ and rookie Pete Alonso of the New York Mets $(319,256)$.

The voting period for "The Primary" concludes this Friday at 4:00 p.m. ET. Later that evening, during the MLB Network Showcase telecast of the New York Yankees hosting the Houston Astros, the top three vote-getters at each position (and the top nine outfielders) in each League will be revealed on MLB Network, and they will move on to the second phase of voting. During the initial voting period, fans can submit up to five ballots per 24 -hour period on MLB platforms, and can vote for every position, or up to 17 unique players per day on Google.
"The Starters Election" will begin at 12:00 p.m. (ET) on Wednesday, June $26^{\text {th }}$, with fans voting among the finalists at each position during a 28 -hour window that at 4:00 p.m. (ET) on Thursday, June $27^{\text {th }}$. Results of "The Starters Election" will be announced at 7:00 p.m. (ET) that night on ESPN on "Google MLB All-Star Election Night." During this second phase of voting, in
 which fans can vote once on MLB platforms and submit up to 17 unique player votes on Google, vote totals will reset (i.e., vote totals from "The Primary" do not carry over) and the winner at each position (including three outfielders per League) will be named a starting position player for the 2019 Midsummer Classic.

The AL All-Star Team, which will be managed by Alex Cora of the defending World Series Champion Boston Red Sox, will have nine elected starters via the fan balloting program, while the NL All-Star Team, led for a second consecutive year by Dave Roberts of the defending NL Champion Los Angeles Dodgers, will have eight fan-elected starters. The pitchers and reserves for both squads - totaling 24 for the NL and 23 for the AL - will be determined through a combination of "Player Ballot" choices and selections made by the Commissioner's Office. The balance of the All-Star rosters will be announced on Sunday, June $30^{\text {th }}$ at 5:30 p.m. ET on ESPN during the "Google MLB All-Star Selection Show."

During each phase of voting, the 2019 Google MLB All-Star Ballot will be available when fans search in English and Spanish. The ballot at MLB.com and Club sites also offers audio CAPTCHA functionality for visually impaired fans. Banco BHD León once again sponsors online All-Star balloting in the Dominican Republic, making Spanish-language ballots available to fans in the D.R. via LasMayores.com, the official Spanish-language web site of Major League Baseball.

Fans will once again have the opportunity to participate in the official voting for the Ted Williams All-Star Game Most Valuable Player Award presented by Chevrolet. During the Midsummer Classic, fans can vote exclusively at MLB.com and the 30 Club sites - online or via their mobile devices - with the 2019 All-Star Game MLB.com MVP Vote, and their collective voice will represent 20 percent of the official vote determining this year's recipient of the Arch Ward Trophy.

MLB All-Star Week includes the MLB All-Star Game presented by Mastercard at Progressive Field (July $9^{\text {th }}$ ), Gatorade All-Star Workout Day featuring the T-Mobile Home Run Derby (July $8^{\text {th }}$ ), All-Star Sunday featuring the SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game and All-Star Celebrity Softball Game (July $7^{\text {th }}$ ), PLAY BALL PARK at the Huntington Convention Center (July $5^{\text {th }}-9^{\text {th }}$ ), plus a lineup of additional events taking place around the city. The $90^{\text {th }}$ Midsummer Classic will be televised nationally by FOX Sports; in Canada by Rogers Sportsnet and RDS; and worldwide by partners in more than 180 countries. FOX Deportes will provide Spanish language coverage in the U.S., while ESPN Radio and ESPN Radio Deportes will provide exclusive national radio coverage of the All-Star Game. MLB Network, MLB.com and SiriusXM also will provide comprehensive All-Star Week coverage.
