Here are some glimpses of life for the Ferrys in Taiwan recently:



We continue to build up our presence and capacity here at the LCMS Asia headquarters in Chiayi (嘉義市), Taiwan. Just this month, we started announcing our presence to the rest of the city with the new sign on the front of our building. At the same time, our partner church added their own sign, announcing this facility as the their Southern Theology Center. And it comes just in time: we are hosting a weekly theology class for interested people from all over the city, taught by the church's mission department head. What a joy to see these things happening, even in the midst of the pandemic, and people coming to us to hear the Word proclaimed and taught.

We continue to attend weekly Divine Service at our local Taiwanese congregation, Salvation Lutheran Church. The pastor and his family have become good friends, and we are blessed by his willingness to reach the community and to teach the Word. The kids have even been attending the church's bi-lingual Sunday School, and have been singing with the congregation in Chinese.



It was, however, difficult to say goodbye recently to our friends the Sovitzky family. Rick has been serving as our Asia Regional Business Manager for the last two years, and we've been working closely together here in the building during that entire time. Our children had grown very close during those two years, and the walls between our homes grew porous! As life goes, the Sovitzky family decided it was time for a vocational change, and so we had to watch them board a bus out of town, leaving a large void in our professional team and in our personal lives. God bless them as they serve in new ways in the USA.



All of this, of course, is happening while we continue living our everyday lives. Charles is daily directing the work of your LCMS missionaries in Asia, and working hard to clear obstacles from the way so they can reach out in over 12 countries. We may be locked down, but we are completely content where we are, and consider ourselves blessed indeed to have your trust, support, and love as we labor where God has placed us through you, His holy Church.
