

**Las Cruces Public Schools
School Board Member Redistricting 10-18-22**

The 2020 Redistricting Data (PL 94-171) that pertains to the LCPS School District contains census block data that shows both School Board Member District's 4 and 5 have seen significant increases in population since 2010, while District has only seen a minor increase in population and District's 2 & 3 have seen population decreases. As such, LCPS School Board Member District's in District's 4 and 5 will see the most adjustment to reduce their population, while increasing population in the remaining districts to create a balance in all five districts within +/- 5% of the mean.

Option 2

The proposed changes to the existing LCPS School Board Member District's under Option 2 are in the areas as follows:

District 1: District 1 will be expanded in three areas into the north side of the district into District 4 and will include the following areas:

- 1) From the east side of the Rio Grande River to the west side of N. Valley Dr, and from the north side of Mesilla Lateral Rd and Wasteway No 6 to the southside of Wildwind Rd (CO Rd D015) and Cochita Ln.
- 2) From the east side of N. Valley Dr to the west side of Dona Ana Rd, and from the north side of Engler Rd to the south sides of Calle Conteno, Amaranta Ct, and from southside of San Ysidro Rd to the north.

District 2: District 2 will undergo two expansions into District 4

- 1) Expansion to the west from the west side of the Rio Grande River along the southside of W. Picacho Rd to the intersection of I-10W and W. Picacho Ave, the new boundary will then transition back to the east along the north side of I-10E S. Fairacres Rd. At Fairacres Rd the boundary will then turn south to La Pradera Rd and then turn west along the south side of La Pradera Rd as it turns to the south along the curve and becomes Calle Llena La Alma, at which point the boundary will continue to the southeast approximately .92 miles along coordinate S16°53'48" E to the northeast side of the curve at Mauer Rd. The new District 2 boundary will then follow the north side Mauer Rd to the east as the road curves and transitions towards the southeast corner of Mesilla Hills Dr. At this intersection the boundary will then continue to the south along the east side of Mesilla Hills Dr to the southeast corner of Raasaf Cr, and then will turn east across the Rio Grande River and connect to the southeast side of Calle del Norte.
- 2) District 2 will expand towards the south and will include all of the area located from the southside of Calle Del Norte, the area located along the eastside of the Rio Grande River to the westside of N. State Hwy 28, and it will also include the area located to the northwest N. State Hwy 28 as it reaches the east side of the Rio Grande River.

District 3: 1) The District 3 boundary will expand to the north into District 5 and include the area along the westside of I-25 & N. Treviz Rd to the existing transition between the existing D1 & D5 Boundary. At this point the boundary will then cross over to the eastside of I-25 and continue north along the east side of I-25 to the southside of US HWY 70 (N. Main St) and turn east to the northwest corner of N. Roadrunner Pkwy.

The new District 3 boundary would then continue south along the eastside of N. Road Runner Pkwy to the southeast corner of Golf Club Rd. At this point the boundary would turn to the northeast along the southside of Golf Club Rd to the south side of Sonoma Springs Ave. It would then follow Sonoma Springs Ave to the east to the northeast corner of Corona del Campo Lp. At this point the boundary will then turn south and follow road to the next intersection and then would follow the eastern side of Corona del Campo Lp to the east side of the drainage path that connects Corona del Campo Lp to Ithaca Ct. The District 3 Boundary will then continue along the southwest side of Ithaca Ct to the northwest corner of Paseo Del Dia and will turn south to the northwest corner of Camino Coyote at which point the boundary will turn to the west for approximately .25 mile along Camino Coyote before it continuing approximately .12 miles to the southwest to coordinate of S3°54'29"W in the middle of South Fork Las Cruces Arroyo at which point the boundary will then continue and additional .25 mile along the coordinate of S23°35'25"E to

connect back to the southeast corner of E Lohman Ave and Paseo Del Onate and terminate back at the existing District 3 Boundary.

2) District 3 will now include the area originating from the southeast corner of E. Lohman Avenue & Paseo de Onate to the existing NE boundary between D4 & D5 located at the northwest corner of S. Sonoma Ranch Rd. and Lohman Ave to the existing SE boundary between D 4 & D5 located approximately .42 miles south along coordinate S48°47'40"E, and then will return along the existing boundary between D4 & D5 to the west approximately .9 miles along coordinate S76°23'14"W terminating at the southeast corner of E. Lohman Avenue & Paseo de Onate.

3) District 3 will also incorporate a small area from District 5 starting from the SE corner of S Telshor Blvd and E. Lohman Ave to the north side of Foothills Rd, and from the eastside of S. Telshor Blvd to the west side of Foothills Rd, all the way to the intersection of E. Lohman Ave and Foothills Rd.

District 4: District 4 will no longer include the following four areas:

1) From the east side of the Rio Grande River to the west side of N. Valley Dr, and from the north side of Mesilla Lateral Rd and Wasteway No 6 to the southside of Wildwind Rd (CO Rd D015) and Cochita Ln.

2) From the east side of N. Valley Dr to the west side of Dona Ana Rd, and from the north side of Engler Rd to the south sides of Calle Conteno, Amaranta Ct, and from southside of San Ysidro Rd to the north.

3) District 4 will no longer include the area starting from the west side of the Rio Grande River along the southside of W. Picacho Rd to the intersection of I-10W and W. Picacho Ave, including the area between the highway as it transitions back to the east along the north side of I-10E S. Fairacres Rd. The area south along the west side of Fairacres Rd as it turns west along the south side of La Pradera Rd following the east side of the road as it turns to the southeast corner of the curve at Calle Llena La Alma at which point as the boundary continues to the southeast .92 miles along coordinate S16°53'48" E to northeast side of the curve a Mauer Rd. The former boundary will continue along the northside Mauer Rd to the east as the road curves and transitions towards the southeast corner of Mesilla Hills Dr. At this intersection the former boundary line will then continue to the south along the east side of Mesilla Hills Dr to the southeast corner of Raasaf Cr, and then will turn east across the Rio Grande River and connect to the southeast side of Calle del Norte. All the area included within this described area will no longer be part of District 4.

4) District 4 will no longer include all of the area located from the southside of Calle Del Norte, to the area located along the eastside of the Rio Grande River to the westside of N. State Hwy 28, and it will also include the area located to the northwest N. State Hwy 28 as it reaches the east side of the Rio Grande River.

District 5: 1) The District 5 boundary will no longer include the area along the westside of I-25 & N. Treviz Rd to the existing transition between the existing D1 & D5 Boundary including the area as it crosses to the east side of I-25 and continues to the north along the east side of I-25 to the southside of US HWY 70 (N. Main St) and turns towards the east and continues to the northwest corner of N. Roadrunner Pkwy.

The new District 5 boundary will now start at the northeast corner of N. Roadrunner Pkwy and US HWY 70 (N Main St) and then continue south along the eastside of N. Road Runner Pkwy to the southeast corner of Golf Club Rd. The new District 5 boundary will then continue to the northeast along the southside of Golf Club Rd to the south side of Sonoma Springs Ave. It would then follow Sonoma Springs Ave to the east to the northeast corner of Corona del Campo Lp. At this point the boundary will then turn south and follow road to the next intersection and then would follow the eastern side of Corona del Campo Lp to the east side of the drainage path that connects Corona del Campo Lp to Ithaca Ct. The District 3 Boundary will then continue along the southwest side of Ithaca Ct to the northwest corner of Paseo Del Dia and will turn south to the northwest corner of Camino Coyote at which point the boundary will turn to the west for approximately .25 mile along Camino Coyote before continuing approximately .12 miles to the southwest to coordinate of S3°54'29"W in the middle of South Fork Las Cruces Arroyo at which point the boundary will then continue an additional .25 miles along the coordinate of S23°35'25"E to connect back to the southeast corner of E Lohman Ave and Paseo Del Onate and terminate back at the existing District 5 Boundary.

2) District 5 will no longer include the area originating from the southeast corner of E. Lohman Avenue & Paseo de Onate to the existing NE boundary between D4 & D5 located at the northwest corner of S. Sonoma Ranch Rd. and Lohman Ave to the existing

SE boundary between D 4 & D5 located approximately .42 miles south along coordinate S48°47'40"E, and then will return along the existing boundary between D4 & D5 to the west approximately .9 miles along coordinate S76°23'14"W terminating at the southeast corner of E. Lohman Avenue & Paseo de Onate.

3) District 5 will also no longer include the area starting from the SE corner of S Telshor Blvd and E. Lohman Ave to the north side of Foothills Rd, and from the eastside of S. Telshor Blvd to the west side of Foothills Rd, all the way to the intersection of E. Lohman Ave and Foothills Rd.
