- 1. Work with a faculty mentor who supports your project & will guide you through the process.
- 2. Collaborate with your faculty mentor to select and narrow a topic/situation about which you are truly interested and to find a group that may need your services.
- 3. Complete this Service Project Plan Form and submit to the CIS Director, with signatures from you <u>and</u> your faculty mentor.
- 4. Research your topic in depth, choose an organization or group to work with, begin contact, settle what service will be provided, provide the service, and report to CIS.
- 5. Complete Practicum Report (instructions found in Practicum Checklist/ CIS Website) Include a minimum of <a href="two-photos">two-photos</a> of student involved in activity.
- 6. <u>Optional</u> Extension: Set up and present a booth at a CIS culture night, collect donations during magnet events, etc.
