Methodology



The Poll was conducted by YouGov using a statewide representative sample of 1,000 California residents interviewed online between Aug 6-15, 2021.

The sample was weighted according to gender, age, race, and education based on the American Community Survey, conducted by the U.S. Bureau of the Census, as well as 2020 Presidential vote, registration status, geographic region, and news interest. Respondents were selected from YouGov's opt-in panel to be representative of all U.S registered voters. The weights range from 0.057 to 7.007, with a mean of 1 and a standard deviation of 1.016.


The margin of error (a 95% confidence interval) for a sample percentage p based upon the entire sample is approximately 4.4%. It is calculated using the formula

$$\hat{p} \pm 100 \times \sqrt{\frac{1 + CV^2}{n}}$$

where CV is the coefficient of variation of the sample weights and n is the sample size used to compute the proportion. This is a measure of sampling error (the average of all estimates obtained using the same sample selection and weighting procedures repeatedly). The sample estimate should differ from its expected value by less than margin of error in 95 percent of all samples. It does not reflect non-sampling errors, including potential selection bias in panel participation or in response to a particular survey.



Electric and zero emission vehicle requirements for personal vehicles and school buses have approval from a majority of CA respondents. Establishing a vehicle to grid credit program has approval from 6 in 10 respondents.


There is widespread support for an infrastructure bill with 64% saying Congress should pass an infrastructure bill and 65% saying it is a good use of public funds.












Should California require all school buses purchased after 2035 to be electric








6 in 10 CA respondents think that CA regulatory agencies should establish a vehicle to grid credit program.



Should CA regulatory agencies establish a vehicle to grid credit program








4 in 10 respondents think that CA should allocate more funding for EV charging infrastructure.



More or less funding for EV charging infrastructure








STATE-TO-FEDERAL/ECONOMIC STIMULUS

Is infrastructure bill a good use of public dollars




