A Letter From Leadership



As the global community continued to face the challenges brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic, HOPE *worldwide* continued to respond with life-saving relief to our brothers and sisters and their neighbors in more than 78 countries. In addition to providing basic supplies in times of crisis, our focus was to empower communities by working with them to create sustainable solutions that have a positive impact on future generations. We are grateful for our amazing donors, volunteers and supporters who, over the past 30 years, have helped us realize this mission of helping those who are materially poor.

The greatest strength of HOPE *worldwide* lies in our ability to connect those in dire need with volunteers and resources – most often with little notice. In 2021, **HOPE worldwide's Global Disaster Response team** provided healthcare, supplies and psychosocial support to 100,000 people in eight disaster sites. This included a response to a 7.2-magnitude earthquake in Haiti and to Hurricane Ida in Louisiana.

Despite the many challenges we faced in 2021, there was a renewed sense of optimism as many of our volunteer programs opened again, allowing our volunteers to reconnect with people throughout the globe to empower change. We were excited to have our **Volunteer Corps** engage and partner with communities around the world supporting programs such as schools, sustainable agriculture and mentoring, just to name a few. **Our Community Service Brigades** continued to send trained medical volunteers to impoverished communities in Central America, providing both immediate care and follow-up visits to ensure continuity of overall community health. **In Kenya**, we continued to work with youth and key populations to improve their quality of life through inclusive programs in the underserved and vulnerable communities. **Our teams in the U.K.** worked with people experiencing homelessness through the Two Step program that offers specialized housing services. And in the United States, HOPE *worldwide* organized local community programs and facilitated training initiatives to teach volunteers thoughtful, dignified ways of engaging with our neighbors

At the end of 2021, we began preparing for the relocation of our offices to Atlanta, Georgia. As some staff moved to Atlanta, we added some bright, new minds to our already strong and experienced team. We believe youth engagement is critical to the future of HOPE *worldwide*. We solicit fresh takes from this diverse pool of idealistic, young and talented hires on how to better serve those in need. We are excited about our new home in Atlanta in 2022.

Our new vision statement is “Every member engaged, every engagement transforming.” We envision a future where every volunteer, every church partner, every supporter of HOPE *worldwide* is not only engaged in the mission of helping the materially poor and emulating the ministry of Jesus but also personally transformed by that engagement. With the help of our volunteers and supporters, we commit to expanding our programs and enhancing our global connection, engagement and impact in response to global crises as they emerge.

Thank you for partnering with us as we serve others. We believe that together we can inspire greater hope.

HOPE *worldwide*

VOLUNTEER CORPS

HOPE *worldwide* mobilizes volunteers to engage with communities to connect, learn and assist with ongoing programs. Over the span of one to two weeks, our HOPE *worldwide* Volunteer Corps programs support schools, sustainable agriculture programs, vocational training centers, women’s empowerment programs, disaster rehabilitation, refugee centers and mentoring programs in materially disadvantaged communities. Extended Service Corps programs are also available.

The HOPEww Volunteer Corps utilizes individuals with unique skill sets but also welcomes humble, good-hearted volunteers ready to roll up their sleeves and serve. Past participants have ranged in age from 5-80 years old and have served either through HOPE Youth Corps, HOPEww Singles Corps, or the multigenerational HOPEww Volunteer Corps, where anyone can serve, and children can participate side by side with their parents and grandparents.

In 2021, the Volunteer Corps chose Micah 6:8 as its theme: “Act Justly, Love Mercy, Walk Humbly.” Despite continuing COVID-19 restrictions, a number of volunteer trips took place and were booked solid, even

beyond capacity in some cases, reflecting a desire of Volunteer Corps participants to re-engage with communities.

The Global Service Internship continued to have a positive impact as a new batch of 24 interns from around the world received leadership training through the HOPEww Volunteer Corps over a period of two years. Using their internships as a springboard, alumni went into the full-time ministry, graduated from medical school, entered the diplomatic corps, pursued PhDs, and are impacting communities in various ways – we are so proud of them.

In recent years, we have been especially pleased to offer HOPEww Volunteer Corps scholarships to youth who cannot afford the fee. This allowed us to extend the program to young volunteers from majority-world countries, such as Rwanda, Nepal and Mexico. In 2021, we provided 75 gifted young people with limited financial resources with scholarships, granting them access to our valuable HOPEww Volunteer Corps programs.



U.S. PROGRAMS

HOPE *worldwide* U.S. trains, equips and supports volunteers across the U.S. to engage with local neighbors during their time of need. Training content focuses on honoring the dignity of those neighbors, opening doors to empowerment and building bridges between communities. While this type of community support can be difficult to achieve in the volunteer-led context, HOPE *worldwide* U.S. staff and volunteers have researched and developed practical and accessible ways for volunteer groups to independently plan and facilitate events and programs which focus on supporting the strengths of their neighbors and building mutually beneficial relationships. In 2021, thousands participated in online and in-person training events and

viewed online resources which have influenced volunteer engagement across the U.S.

HOPE *worldwide* U.S. also trains and supports 300 Community Engagement Leaders who, in 2021, planned and facilitated events and program sessions which provided volunteer opportunities for over 10,000 volunteers. Many of those opportunities took place within the 120 volunteer-led HOPEww Chapters which span the country. These groups, in partnership with local schools and other community organizations, mobilized volunteers to support local neighbors who are refugees, elderly, experiencing homelessness or facing other challenges.

In addition to Chapters, HOPEww volunteers across the U.S. facilitate 30 HOPEww Scouts Troops

which provide educational and volunteer activities to help children and their families understand the importance of respectful community engagement. Despite COVID-19 restrictions, HOPEww Scouts Troops continued to support their local communities, holding feminine hygiene drives, filling Easter eggs for local group homes, reaching out to elderly neighbors, and making cards for frontline workers. Troops also held multiple fundraisers, including talent shows, bake sales, walkathons and garage sales.

In the U.S., HOPE *worldwide* is known for its dedicated, thoughtful and diverse group of volunteers. They are the backbone of our organization and always make us proud.

HOPE *worldwide* youth leaders have an impact locally and nationally as they strive to engage their neighbors and peers in shaping our neighborhoods into communities that better reflect God's love and justice.

U.S. YOUTH PROGRAMS

HOPE *worldwide*'s Youth Programs staff trains young people to engage with local neighbors in ways that honor their dignity and build mutually beneficial relationships. These empowered volunteers, in turn, share fresh perspectives and ideas which support and promote HOPE *worldwide*'s work and mission.

The North American Youth Advisory Council (NYAC) is a robust, experiential learning program that provides training and collaboration opportunities to an annual cohort of high school and college servant leaders. Informed by this training, each participant designs and leads a fundraiser and a relationship-focused "Passion Program" in partnership with a local community organization. 2021's programs included disaster recovery work in indigenous communities, building relationships with neighbors experiencing homelessness, English conversation buddies with international newcomers, and gardening with residents of a senior community. Lola and AJ, two members of the 2021 cohort, planned and hosted "For the Culture," a virtual fundraising event which reflected on the role that faith-based entities play in developing

informed global citizens. Amanda held an "Insane International Cook-Off," and Claudia presented a "Smoothie Challenge" to raise funds. Whether by illuminating complicated issues or finding fun and tasty ways to solicit support, council members learn valuable skills and, with the help of generous donors, raise funds to further the work of HOPE *worldwide*.

The Justice Alliance, a youth-led team of nine passionate members committed to "speak out on behalf of the voiceless and for the rights of all who are vulnerable," was established to expand messaging and ensure justice and dignity in every aspect of HOPE *worldwide*'s U.S. volunteer work. The team has researched pertinent topics such as human trafficking, inequity in education and healthcare disparities

and implemented changes to multiple training curricula and programs.

Finally, HOPEww Campus Clubs were created to enhance campus ministry efforts through compassionate outreach and community engagement initiatives on and around various campuses across the United States, providing great opportunities for leadership training, spiritual enrichment and character development.

Through programs like these, HOPE *worldwide* youth leaders have an impact locally and nationally as they strive to engage their neighbors, churches, classmates and peers in shaping our neighborhoods into communities that better reflect God's love and justice.



COMMUNITY SERVICE BRIGADES

The HOPE *worldwide* Community Service Brigades provide short-term, high-impact volunteer opportunities for those in the medical, dental, counseling, and education fields to use their skills and experience to serve those who are materially poor. We visit most brigade sites twice a year for follow-up medical check-ups, care, and medicine distribution for patients with chronic health conditions. Trained medical volunteers are joined by helpful, non-medical volunteers to provide immediate care as well as health hygiene training and resources to help produce longer-term impact. We supply families with multi-vitamins and antiparasitic medicine as well as fluoride treatments and dental hygiene education.

The Community Service Brigades are designed for sustainable impact in that they help build long-term partnerships with local churches to equip them with the tools needed to combat the effects of material poverty in the communities they serve. HOPE *worldwide* volunteers come alongside host country volunteers, and together, they provide these medical, dental and education programs, all aimed at empowering local communities.

In 2021, despite COVID restrictions in some countries, HOPEww held

Community Service Brigades in Honduras and El Salvador. HOPEww provided medicines to local physicians and patients in Nicaragua and Venezuela. Overall, HOPEww filled 3,000 prescriptions, distributed 150,000 vitamins and conducted 1,100 patient visits for those in Central America who had little or no access to healthcare services.

To date, HOPE *worldwide* has served our global family with more than 2,100 volunteers through 60 Community Service Brigades in seven countries.

GLOBAL DISASTER RESPONSE

For more than two decades, HOPE *worldwide* has been a leader in responding to some of the world's most devastating disasters. In addition to providing much-needed immediate relief when disasters strike, we also focus on ways to help our global family recover and rebuild for long-term healing. Our efforts include sustainable support in education and training for emergency preparedness, and capacity assessments to help with future planning and response.

In 2021, HOPE *worldwide* responded in eight different sites around the world and quickly mobilized volunteers serving more than 100,000 people in disaster-affected communities by providing food, water, shelter, health care, clothing and psychosocial assistance. In North America alone, more than 1,000 volunteers provided direct relief to some 3,000 families. In Louisiana, Hurricane IDA struck the New Orleans/ Baton Rouge areas and caused major damage to the region. The HOPE *worldwide* Global Disaster

Response team helped to clean up debris and provided immediate relief, including food and shelter to the victims of this disaster. In Les Cayes, Haiti, an earthquake brought great devastation to the region. HOPE *worldwide* provided relief supplies and funding to help rebuild or repair 22 homes damaged by the earthquake.

Following is a breakdown of donated disaster supplies and services in 2021:

- 100,000 pounds of food
- 1,000 pounds of medical supplies
- 1,000 emergency shelters
- 1,500 hygiene kits
- 1,250 water filters
- 40 houses rebuilt/repared
- 1,000 children received psychosocial support





HOPE *worldwide*

PROCUREMENT

The Procurement Department of HOPE *worldwide* secures donated medicine, supplies and equipment from corporate, government and nonprofit partners for communities around the world. This gifts-in-kind program benefits communities experiencing extreme material poverty and who are in dire need of medical services, emergency food and supplies, or clean drinking water. These in-kind gifts are distributed to HOPE *worldwide* programs and disaster relief sites as needs arise. We have procured

and distributed vital goods to the Sonja Kill Memorial Hospital in Cambodia as well as many communities in Central America served by the HOPE *worldwide* Community Service Brigades, and other HOPE *worldwide* programs throughout our global network.

Most of this tremendous impact is made possible by our strategic corporate partners that help bring these vital resources to communities. Our partners include AmeriCares, Direct Relief International, Heart

to Heart International, Blessings International, Feed the Children, Wine to Water, and others. Through these generous partners, the Procurement Department of HOPE *worldwide* secured over \$6 million in in-kind contributions in 2021.

In aggregate, spanning over 20 years, the Procurement Department of HOPE *worldwide* has delivered more than 150 sea containers of life-saving medicines, medical supplies, disaster relief supplies and medical equipment valued at over \$275 million.

BOTSWANA

HOPE *worldwide* has programs in Botswana focused on HIV prevention, treatment and care among orphans and vulnerable children, as well as adolescent girls and young women. The programs aim to achieve greater control over the HIV epidemic in Botswana and reduce the spread of the disease.

Targeting some of the hardest hit sub-populations, HOPE *worldwide* Botswana provides critical HIV services, including prevention programs and linkage to testing and counseling. We conduct home visits, offer treatment literacy and viral load tracking, and assess and refer beneficiaries for HIV testing services. We help to identify HIV-positive pregnant women and refer them to

programs for early infant diagnosis.

HOPE *worldwide* Botswana tracks developmental milestones in HIV-exposed and infected children. Children under five years old are provided free monthly growth monitoring at health facilities where the children's weight and other vitals are checked. All children are given free supplementary soya bean porridge. If a child is found with growth challenges, the parent is counseled on how to remedy the situation.

Sesi (not her real name) is HIV positive, a 37-year-old mother of six children and one granddaughter. In 2021, she sought help from the programs offered by HOPE *worldwide* Botswana. The HOPE

worldwide Botswana Program Officer concluded that Sesi was in denial of her HIV positive status and offered her HIV counseling and education. Sesi then stated she was ready to enroll in antiretroviral therapy (ART), but she was ashamed to go to the clinic alone. The Program Officer accompanied her to the clinic where she was successfully enrolled in ART. Sesi was very grateful and promised to adhere to medication.

The intervention and treatment services offered to those in Botswana like Sesi are helping to reduce the spread of AIDS and to protect other vulnerable individuals like Sesi's six children and her granddaughter.



HOPE *worldwide*

KENYA

HOPE *worldwide* established programs in Kenya in 1999 with a vision to help youth, children, and key populations in underserved and vulnerable communities improve their quality of life through inclusive health programming. Our vision is to realize ‘Empowered, Healthy and Safe Communities’ in Kenya. HOPE *worldwide* Kenya seeks to address the problem of limited access to health services among high-risk populations to reduce their vulnerability to HIV/AIDS.

In 2021, HOPE *worldwide* Kenya, through funds from the U.S.

President’s Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR), served over 45,000 Adolescent Girls and Young Women (AGYW) aged 9-24 years through age-appropriate combination prevention strategies in 31 informal settlements in Nairobi County. In October, the project scaled up to reach over 77,000 AGYWs through a sub-grant from the Center for International Health, Education, and Biosecurity – Kenya. The program is dubbed DREAMS, which means Determined, Resilient, Empowered, AIDS-free, Mentored, and Safe lives. It combines evidence-based approaches beyond the health sector, addressing the structural

drivers that directly and indirectly increase girls’ HIV risk, including poverty, gender inequality, sexual violence and a lack of education.

The program provides interventions for people who are engaging in risky sexual behaviors (including female sex workers) as well as users who inject drugs. The interventions include HIV testing and treatment services, STIs and cervical cancer screening, and gender-based post-violence care. The program helps people living with HIV to receive viral load results followed by care and treatment, including follow-up support and counseling.

CANADA

HOPE *worldwide* began a program in Toronto, Canada, in 1993 and has since then expanded to 12 Chapters that serve thousands of people in most of Canada's major urban centers. HOPE *worldwide* Canada's mission is to develop innovative programs and events that engage volunteers to help others in their time of need. Our programs include outreach to those experiencing homelessness, children in foster care, and senior citizens. We are 100% volunteer run and led, and our dedicated volunteers continue to devote their time and energy to serve others.

Our Chapters across Canada strive to develop programs and partnerships which tap into the strengths of the local community and are based on mutuality and respect. In 2021, we partnered with the Canadian Blood Services and conducted a national blood donation drive. We also had an event called "Dress for Success" which was focused on empowering women to achieve economic independence by providing them with a network of support, professional attire, and development tools to help them thrive in work and in life. In addition, we held our first-ever national fundraiser called "HOPE in Action" which saw over 200 participants from coast to coast raise over

\$52,000 to support needs in their local communities.

The diverse, multicultural richness of Canada is reflected in our care, concern and support of needs in our wider international community. HOPE *worldwide* Canada was privileged to support programs in a dozen other countries, including COVID-19 relief in India and disaster relief (funding for food, water, tents and sleeping bags) to those affected by the earthquake in Haiti.

In 2021, HOPE *worldwide* Canada mobilized 600 volunteers who gave over 1,100 hours to their communities serving over 8,100 people across the nation.



HOPE *worldwide*

INDONESIA

HOPE *worldwide* programs in Indonesia were established in 1994 with a simple mission to love those who are materially poor, sick and in need of support. The country of Indonesia is located in the Pacific Ring of Fire and has a high risk of being vulnerable to natural disasters. HOPE *worldwide* Indonesia provides disaster preparedness education for schools, communities, institutions and companies through the Community Based Disaster Risk Reduction (CBDRR) Program. This program helps build resilience in impoverished and vulnerable communities in Indonesia and prepares the Indonesian people to reduce the risk of harm in the event of a natural disaster.

In addition to our disaster preparedness program, we also provide integrated healthcare centers where mothers and children receive kindness and medical support from healthcare workers in the community. The clinics, located in various villages throughout Indonesia, provide health checks and immunizations for children as well as care for young mothers.

We also offer a computer training program, using a compassionate, solution-based and technology-focused approach to support people in impoverished communities to develop much-needed job skills.

We not only teach computer skills but also accuracy,

readiness at work and perseverance. These skills help the participants to earn higher wages and have a brighter future. We also have a preschool program on the island of Nias that provides a haven for children ages 4-6 years old to learn and build their character through play under the supervision of devoted and purposeful educators.

Supported by a passionate team of dedicated staff and volunteers, HOPE *worldwide* Indonesia offers sustainable programs that inspire hope and provide empowerment to communities throughout Indonesia.

MALAYSIA

HOPE worldwide Malaysia was established in 2000 with a vision to help families in marginalized communities through programs that focus on five core areas: health, food, education, volunteerism and corporate shared values.

Our food distribution program provides monthly groceries to families in their time of need. We also have two mobile health clinics that engage a group of dedicated volunteer doctors and nurses to provide free, high-quality healthcare services to urban, marginalized communities in Penang, Bukit Mertajam, and Northern Perak.

We believe that education is the path for children from low-income families and marginalized communities to break the cycle of poverty. Our

education programs include My Reading Program that helps children learn English in a fun environment through engaging activities like teaching phonics, reading exercises, and games. We also provide a Robotics Education Program that empowers young people with problem solving, engineering and basic programming skills. Our Mental Healthcare Education Program provides basic mental healthcare education and mentoring via Zoom meetings and includes a series of discussions and activities to equip young people who are undergoing various challenges. And our Penang 1 Stop IT Resource Center provides multimedia facilities for underprivileged students to do printing and binding for school projects and perform online research.

HOPE worldwide Malaysia also focuses on providing volunteer opportunities and cultivating corporate social responsibility (CSR) in collaboration with our corporate donors and educational institutions in Malaysia. We provide “Community and Volunteerism” talks for corporations and educational campuses to inspire individuals to give back to society and to their local communities.

For the past 22 years, HOPE worldwide Malaysia’s dedicated staff and volunteers have developed a total of 10 programs and have expanded to eight states across Malaysia.

PAPUA NEW GUINEA

HOPE *worldwide* Papua New Guinea (PNG) has medical clinics that provide health services to vulnerable individuals living in the outskirts of Port Moresby, the nation's capital city, and in the Central Highlands remote communities of Moroma, Bokolma and Kalewary.

During 2021, many health facilities across the country were closed due to the economic impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. Through its partnership with the PNG government, donors and the community, HOPE *worldwide* PNG managed to keep its clinics open and delivered essential primary healthcare services to almost 55,000 people. Healthcare services included a nutrition clinic, maternal and

pediatric health care, gender-based violence treatment and counseling, HIV testing and treatment, TB testing and treatment, laboratory services for malaria, treatment of leprosy and other skin diseases, and COVID-19 triaging and testing.

The Central Highlands region is extremely mountainous, and the local population has very limited access to health services. The Kalewary Health Clinic is our most remote health facility. Getting there requires a two-hour plane flight from the capital city, Port Moresby, to Mount Hagen, followed by a two-hour tortuous drive up the mountains to Gumine, followed by a six-hour walk because there is no road!

HOPE *worldwide* PNG also supports primary education through the

provision of essential school supplies and books to remote communities, as well as implementing a nurturing care framework at the Mercy Care school in Port Moresby to create a safe learning environment for children.

Safe drinking water is not available in many remote villages in Papua New Guinea, resulting in a high incidence of water-borne diseases. Through HOPE *worldwide*'s partnership with a trusted organization, Wine to Water, 3,000 people, including households, the village primary school and the health clinic, who did not previously have access to clean drinking water, received water filters and were trained to use them, resulting in the prevention of disease from drinking contaminated water.



PHILIPPINES

HOPE *worldwide* Philippines has established a model child welfare and protection system in the Philippines for children in need of special protection, specifically those who are victims of child sexual abuse, exploitation and violence. Since 1993, it has provided child protection and advocacy services, education, health and nutrition services, community support services and most importantly the presence of caring, full-time staff who work directly with materially poor children and their families.

Children who have been abused, neglected or abandoned are identified through the community-based and advocacy programs and through other organizations' referrals. These children are then directed to receive comprehensive treatment interventions at the center-based program (Center of HOPE-Laguna). The program addresses the needs of children at every stage of the care continuum, from short-term medical treatment to long-term psychosocial support, rehabilitation, case management and placement. A multidisciplinary team composed of a social worker, counselor, psychologist, teacher, house parents, lawyer and medical

doctor/nurses conduct a weekly case conference to discuss, assess and propose individualized treatment strategies for each child.

At the Center of HOPE, children are educated on their rights and are given adequate and appropriate information to help them assert their personal decisions and choices. The children receive social services at the Centers, including early childhood education, essential nutrition and medical treatment. HOPE *worldwide* Philippines' comprehensive child welfare system helps over 50,000 impoverished Filipino children annually.



TIJUANA

Just south of San Diego over the international border lies the Los Laureles neighborhood of Tijuana, Baja California, Mexico. Los Laureles Canyon has faced many economic and environmental challenges, including a contaminated water supply, toxins in the soil, and dust that significantly impacts public health, particularly the health of children. Despite these challenges, the people of this humble neighborhood are well organized and working hard to create a stronger, healthier community. HOPE *worldwide* Tijuana has come alongside local residents, community leaders, and a nearby school and church to join them on their transformative journey of community empowerment.

In 2021, HOPE *worldwide* Tijuana offered a broad range of relief, rehabilitation and development

programs to orphans, vulnerable children and families who are residents of Tijuana and the surrounding communities. These included ongoing dental care, a variety of educational programs, tutoring, as well as the distribution of food and supplies to children and their families in materially poor communities.

Also in 2021, we began the final building and design phase of the new Tijuana Center of HOPE *worldwide*, which upon completion in 2022 will serve to further empower impoverished families and vulnerable children in the Los Laureles Canyon neighborhood and surrounding communities of Tijuana, Mexicali and Ensenada. The Center will significantly bolster our programs by housing a dental office and children's lending library, hosting an after-school tutoring academy, serving as a hub for training and

mobilizing short-term service teams, and storing equipment and supplies necessary to deliver these services to children in migrant shelters, daycare ministries and orphanages. Our outreach includes providing services to the only orphanage for HIV-positive children in Baja California. In addition, the programs at the Center will include Early Childhood Development (ECD), English as a Second Language (ESOL), and education for healthy nutrition and environment. All of these programs aim at empowering local residents to grow and thrive.

The Tijuana Center of HOPE *worldwide*, coupled with strategic binational partnerships, position HOPE *worldwide* Tijuana to effectively assist in strengthening this community and its significant population of vulnerable children.



UNITED KINGDOM

In the United Kingdom, HOPE worldwide UK has a mission to empower people to overcome poverty, homelessness and addiction through our compassionate service. We work in collaboration with many different organizations to love and support our neighbors in need, helping to inspire greater hope.

One of our signature programs in the U.K. is the Two Step program, which was launched in 1993 in response to the many people sleeping on the streets of London. The genesis of Two Step occurred when two volunteers, motivated by their Christian faith, felt called to do something about homelessness in London. These volunteers spent five days and nights on the streets; they spoke with those who were experiencing homelessness and gained wisdom from what they learned. In time, they formed a small team, providing food, clothing and human connection to those on the streets.

Two Step offers a specialized housing service for singles experiencing homelessness. Partnering with night shelters, day centers, councils, charities and accommodation providers, Two Step has found housing for 7,407 people since its inception. In a typical year, Two Step helps approximately 200 people find housing. The program was the recipient of the Landlord and Letting Awards Public Service/Not for Profit Winner for 2014-15.

Here are some highlights from Two Step in 2021:

- Received 718 referrals from local organizations to house people in London
- Housed 192 people
- Partnered with 34 organizations to facilitate referrals

Recent research points to some 282,000 people, including singles, couples and families, who will experience or be threatened with homelessness in England (statistics

from 2020-21), with numbers expected to rise as the U.K. faces its worst cost-of-living crisis in more than 70 years. But Two Step staff and volunteers stand ready to face the crisis with determination and dedication by helping people to access and remain housed, and moving them toward education, training and employment.

Rob Payne, Director of Homeless Services for HOPE worldwide UK says, *“I attribute Two Step’s success to our Christian ethos and connection with supporting churches, which has allowed us to have a stable team on staff since most of our staff are disciples of Christ who want to remain working for HOPE worldwide.”* He added, *“The stability of our team helps us maintain good relationships with landlords and referral agencies since relationships are built over time.”*

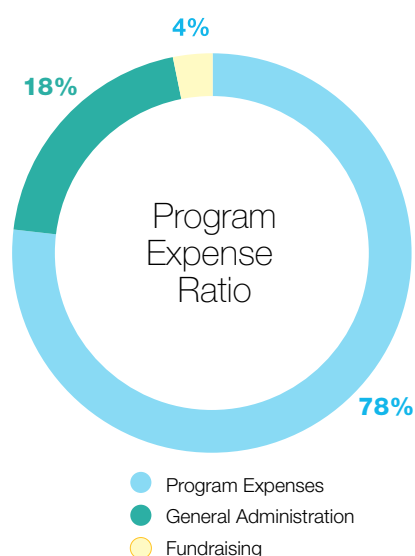
