GOSPEL MEDITATION

May 5, 2024

6th Sunday of Easter

Once a man came to the Vatican and asked to see Pope John Paul II, claiming that they had been friends in Poland. When told of the man, the Pope said, “He is mistaken about our friendship. I don’t recall ever having suffered with him.” As it turned out, the man had never known the Pope. Now, I’m not sure if the story is totally factual. But doesn’t the juxtaposition of *suffering* with *friendship* sound exactly like JP II? He understood that the deepest and most lasting friendships are forged in the fires of shared suffering. No suffering, no friendship. Amazing.

This week we hear Jesus say to the apostles and to us, “**You are my friends if you do what I command you**” (John 15:14).



In Jesus’ life, death, and resurrection, God entered the world of human suffering and transformed it into an avenue of friendship with Himself. Following His command — to love, to lay down our lives for others — will always entail suffering. But this suffering only deepens our friendship with Him. His suffering is ours; ours is His. We have become friends of God.

This week, how might you share your suffering with the Risen Jesus? How might he be sharing his suffering with you, in the lives of those around you? Be attentive to that, and you’ll find that you are indeed a friend of God, because you’ve suffered together a great deal.

Holy Week

I can't believe we are already into the third week of Easter! Looking back, I am grateful to everyone who made Holy Week beautiful and prayerful this year. We welcomed 40 new members into the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil, and many visitors

and guests at the Masses on Easter Sunday. It was great to see the church filled to overflowing. Holy Thursday is always my favorite liturgy of the Triduum, and this year was no exception. We placed the altar of repose in the Great Hall, and I was amazed at how many people stayed to pray with the Lord and how many were still there at midnight. I'm already looking forward to next year.

Thank You, Irene Haefele

Irene Haefele, after 8 years as the coordinator of the OCIA (formerly known as the RCIA), announced that she will be stepping down this year. Irene, and her husband Ray, have been excellent and committed leaders of this ministry and we are deeply grateful to them. Many people have come to know and love the Catholic Church because of them. Thank you!

178 Confirmations!

Last week we welcomed Archbishop Coakley and he confirmed (with my help) 178 young men and women. It was a wonderful celebration of God's grace and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon these young Catholics. Thanks to everyone who helped make a special celebration and we offer to our newly confirmed our continued support and prayers as they live out their faith as fully initiated Catholics.

Sanctuary Improvements (see photo)

Thanks to a crew from the F.C. Zeigler Co. of Tulsa, the crucifix now hangs prominently in the center of the sanctuary. Moving it several feet over and up has produced a dramatic and powerful effect. Jesus is no longer concelebrating from the side but is presiding as the Great

High Priest from the center. Visually there is no question that what we celebrate at Mass is the re-presentation of the sacrifice of Jesus Christ. Also, the granite pedestal that was in the adoration chapel is now in the sanctuary to be a worthy place for the Tabernacle. It is made from the same material as the altar and ambo. In addition, I am working with a lightening specialist to add spotlights to the crucifix and Tabernacle, and I've been brainstorming several ideas of how we can raise the priest and deacon chairs in the sanctuary so you can see more than just the top of Fr. Manti's head. Stay tuned.

New Furniture for the Church Lobby

The new furniture for the church lobby will be installed next Wednesday. I am excited to update our gathering area and provide areas for us to gather and meet. The existing furniture will be given to the Peru mission.

New Rectory Update (see photo)

We received our building permit this week from the City of Edmond and construction is already underway. The crews at Matt Wilson Homes did some pad work, removed the topsoil, put up site fencing and installed erosion controls. They have surveyors ready to stake out the footing envelope, the foundation crew is set up, and they met with the truss manufacture to discuss floor and roof trusses. An elm tree had to be removed because it was in the way of the foundation but the other trees on the property will remain. Stay tuned.



On a Personal Note...

After Easter I drove to Crown Point, IN (near Chicago) for the funeral of my godmother, Mary Jo Duckett. She was 85 and an older sister of my mother. We were very close. I visited her in January, and we sat and talked and drank coffee at her kitchen table for an entire day, just like we had many times before. I celebrated and preached her wake and funeral Mass, and I wore the vestment she made me for my ordination at her funeral. Thank you for your support and prayers. May she rest in peace.

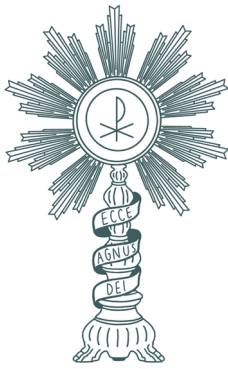

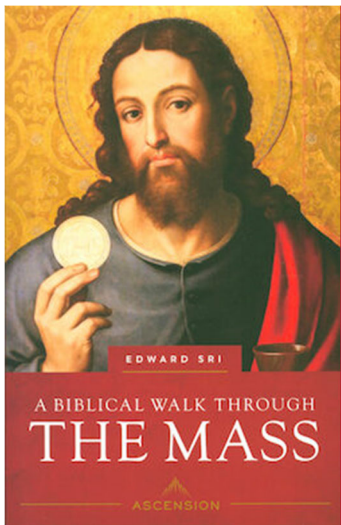

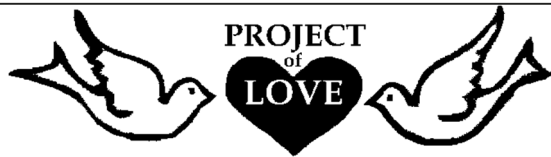

In addition to our core Family 2 Family (F2F) program that connects sponsors with a Peruvian family, St. John benefactors also support several other outreach programs in Piura under the direction of Fr. Joe Uhen. As we begin celebrating 25 years with our sister parish, Santisimo Sacramento, we will be highlighting the various programs we have supported over the years. For this Messenger, we are featuring the Soup Kitchen.

The Soup Kitchen Ministry in Piura – Vaso de Leche

Did you know that 5 days/week, teams of 2-3 mothers in 12 different villages serve breakfast to hungry neighborhood children in Piura? They arrive before daybreak to start the wood fire that will cook an oatmeal porridge that may be that child's only meal of the day. The children arrive at 6:00 am. with their empty cup. In addition to the porridge, they also receive another “diet-enriching” item. It could be a piece of fruit, a chunk of bread, or a bag of quinoa or protein powder. The number served varies by village size, but it ranges from 25 – 100+ young children usually under the age of 10.

On a night just before Christmas, the children get a special treat - hot chocolate, some holiday bread, & a small toy/ stuffed animal.

The village of Los Polvorines is fortunate to operate their Soup Kitchen from a small, secure home that stores all their supplies. Other villages are not as fortunate, so they may operate out of their village chapel, someone's house, or in a central market area.

Often, visiting missionaries have the opportunity to serve this breakfast.

Not only does this program make a difference in the lives of hundreds of children, but it also helps the village build community as they come together to serve their neighbors. Several sponsors contribute to this program, but we can always use more!

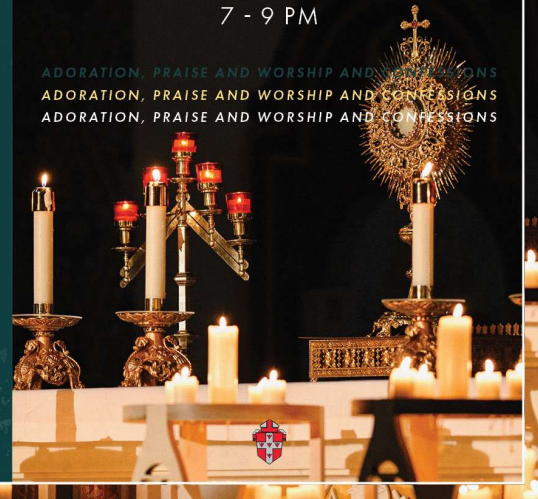
