Mekane Yesus Seminary—Yesterday was my first day in the classroom. Fall Semester for the 2016/2017 school year has officially begun. Technically, yesterday was still considered part of registration week and formal instruction wasn't expected to start until next week, but this was a second-year Masters class so the students were all familiar with the routine and didn't need any more time to get registered or oriented. They were all anxious to begin the school year and eager to learn, so they all came to class ready to learn and I came prepared to teach. I taught for four hours straight, with only one brief coffee/tea break in the middle. The class stayed tuned in the whole time and asked good questions. The time flew by.

On August 20th , we had a special graduation for men graduating from the summer Bachelors of Theology program. That program is scheduled so that men



who are unable to enroll full-time for the normal school year can still take classes through the summers and complete the BTh program to become ordained pastors. We had fourteen summer BTh graduates. God's blessings to all of them.

- Krista & Joel Young and their two daughters arrived on the field and are our neighbors. Krista will work to coordinate LCMS mission teams and projects in Ethiopia.

Engaging Ethiopia



Mekanisa—Only about 5 minutes from our house, we visited a local shop that raises silk moths in order to harvest the silk that they use to make their cocoons. They then spin the silk into thread and make beautiful scarves, rugs, towels and more. While visiting there, our girls were given two caterpillars which then spun cocoons at our house and eventually metamorphosed into silk moths. They have now laid more than 30 eggs—we're waiting to see if they'll hatch. God's creations are amazingly complex and beautiful.

Amharic—this is our language. After first meeting someone, you might say ተና ይሰጣልኝ፡ (tenaisṭəlləñ)May he (God) give you health on my behalf.
