Fellowship moments like these are so key to our identity as Christians, sons and daughters of God and members of the body of Christ!

A translated excerpt from Rafael's Good Friday Sermon: April 15, 2022

This is the most unjust suffering ever known, and yet God allows it to happen. In fact, it is even God's plan, yes, His plan, to let this pain and agony happen to the most righteous man who has ever lived. Brothers & Sisters: Truly, it is my sins and yours that Jesus suffers. I deserve and you deserve God's judgment of death, because we have transgressed and rebelled against our Creator.

When we look at our past, when we examine our consciences and see all the ungodly thoughts, when we remember all the offensive words, when we reflect on all the evil actions, and all our failures in life, both in doing, thinking, and speaking as we should... then we can see the disaster we have made with our lives. It is necessary to be honest today – because there are no excuses, no rationalizations. We do not deserve any fellowship with God or any blessing from Him. My sins and my whole sinful nature prevent this.

That cross should be mine and yours, for the wages of sin is death.

Today, Good Friday, we see this man on the cross! This is His purpose. This is why God became man. This is why the eternal second person of the Trinity has taken on human flesh. This is why. Behold the man on the cross, bleeding, suffering, agonizing, and dying.

This was God's plan to bring us salvation. Jesus' death instead of sinners sought forgiveness of sins for all mankind. Isaiah expresses it this way:

"But he was pierced for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his wounds we are healed."

(Isaiah 53:5)

Plans continue to be discussed and made regarding our transition to Chile. We've spoken with the Chilean church leadership and an immigration lawyer. The type of visa we will apply for has been selected and we are collecting paperwork to submit for that. Please pray for peace and patience in the paperwork process!
