Getting Up to Speed

We are preparing pastors, evangelists, and deaconesses as fast as we can for the fast-growing church here. Pictured below is Peter. He joined one of the mission churches, having been a youth minister in a Pentecostal church. His bishop has recommended and sent him for pastoral training even though he has not had basic confirmation instruction yet! (This also happened a few years ago when I was in South

Sudan.) So, one of my jobs as campus chaplain is meeting with him for catechism instruction. He



will be accelerating from convert to clergy in three years.

There are several other students who will have to accelerate as quickly as they can. They were here last semester, went home during the two-week break, and now, three weeks after the start of this semester, they have returned. They were delayed not so much by COVID as just plain regulations and paperwork.

So, class rosters tend to be dynamic. Several students Vance expected in one class are not in that class, as it turns out, but overall, they are mostly replaced by other students who were not expected. *Please pray for us*, praising God for the Spirit's work in causing faith, thanking Him for bringing us students eager to learn, and asking Him to give each of us the wisdom, understanding and abilities we need.

Linda's weekly Deaconess Bible study has resumed with some new faces. She is now doing a study of Genesis. The Deaconess students who come enjoy the study and also

get to keep the study guide. Any resources that students can take with them to use in their work are always greatly appreciated. Building Up Room for Building Up

Five weeks ago, right after the graduation ceremony, ground was broken for a new classroom building. It has been interesting watching the progress each day, just up the hill from our house. It was not quite done in the two weeks some predicted but is almost finished. It will contain two offices and one classroom that is larger than our others. We will probably still be rearranging the chapel several days each week for other classes, but this new classroom will be greatly appreciated.

Books are Precious

As was mentioned in August, one challenge here is having textbooks for classes. They are not published in Africa. Usually, they are brought in suitcases of missionaries



and visiting volunteers, some of whom will be traveling this way after Christmas. We have put together a wish

list of books. Textbooks that are to be checked out by students, including:

-15 copies of Called by the Gospel, New Testament introduction, \$43 each.



-15 copies of The Christian Faith, \$32 each (for Christian Doctrine class).

There are also books that will be used for class and then kept by students as a resource:

-28 copies of Luther's Small Catechism with Explanation, \$16 each

- 28 copies of Concordia's Complete Bible Handbook, \$21 each

- 30 copies of Visitation, \$24 each. Also needed is: Abingdon Bible

Land Map Set, \$190 each
