Easter Confirmation

On Easter Sunday, Vance preached at Lwanda church where, along with four baptisms, Peter was confirmed, with our Principal as the officiant. Peter is a pastoral student, sponsored by LCMS, whom Vance instructed in the catechism. He was

confirmed here because his home is 60 miles from the nearest Lutheran church.
When he graduates, he will be expected to go back and start a mission congregation there.

Please pray for us, praising God for drawing all people to Himself, thanking Him for the gift of pastors, teachers and evangelists, and asking Him to keep growing His church.

Before they went, Vance was able to give them some books so that they will have a very small library of resources. Some are those he has written for

classes. Some, like the Swahili Small Catechisms with explanation are provided by Lutheran Heritage Foundation, and a couple were purchased through the Matongo Education Project Fund with donations from supporters.

The most valuable of these is the Concordia Complete Bible Handbook. Since there were not enough of these for everyone, those who will be coming back for more

classes after internship have to wait. The two challenges to providing these books are the significant cost and also

Bible reflection

A week after Jesus' resurrection, the disciples were still hiding in fear behind closed doors. Jesus overcame those closed doors when he came and said, "Peace be with you." The fact that Jesus is alive and able to be with us no matter what gives us peace that can take away our fear.

But, just as for Thomas, and all of the other disciples before him, it is hard for us to believe this because of our closed minds that see the troubles around us but don't clearly see Jesus. Jesus said, "Peace be with you," again to Thomas when he showed him his hands but he also said we can believe without seeing. That is because he also gave his Holy Spirit.

When Jesus said, "Peace be with you." a third time he went on to tell them that they now had power to forgive the sins of others. This forgiveness is what opens a closed heaven for us and for others. Because of the peace given by the risen Jesus, we are freed from fear to come out from our closed doors and boldly go into all the world sharing the wonderful news of forgiveness that gives peace with God forever.
