They are now home again at the foot of Mt. Kilimanjaro. We also visited St. Peter Lutheran Seminary where Rev. Clausing is now teaching.

Bible reflection

It is not beginning to look a lot like Christmas here in equatorial Africa. It looks pretty much the same as always.

This is also what it was like when Jesus was first born. In a land where people worked hard every day just to survive and government regulations weren't helping any, a baby born and laid in a manger didn't look like anything special. No one would have imagined that He was a king, the promised Messiah or God himself. People would not

expect that He would do miracles, rise again from the dead or even survive long enough to grow up.

The only way anyone knew about Him or recognized Him was that God's messengers told them. God's word alone caused and revealed the truth.

This is still true as Jesus comes to us today in His sacraments. We recognize Him and His work not by anything we can see but by hearing and believing what He tells us in His word.

Praise God for the angels (which means messengers) who are sent by God to share with us this word.

Please pray for us, praising God for His amazing ways, thanking Him for our Savior and all His gifts and asking Him to help us all to know His presence with us.
