Walter Steele will replace him as head of the Department of Exegetical Theology and also be Dean of Chapel.

Vance is learning a lot about being a teacher here in Kenya, much of it by discovering what it was he should have done. One thing he has learned is how to be an "invigilator." That is a British term for someone who monitors the giving of an exam. There are some very specific rules about how exams and other things are done here. The students are not the only ones with a lot to learn!
