

OREGON LAW: FARM USE

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Farm Use (defined at ORS 215.203.)

This statute defines farm use as a for-profit activity and includes the raising, harvesting, preparation, storage, marketing and sales of farm crops, livestock or by-products raised on the farmland. Types of allowable uses may be subject to county review, and include:

- Direct sales and marketing
- U-pick
- U-cut
- Christmas tree sales
- Community-Supported Agriculture (CSAs), limited to crops grown/harvested on-site

Limitations and requirements:

- Sales are limited to crops and livestock grown and harvested on-site.



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
