



THE LATEST NUMBERS: NEW TARIFFS HITTING NEW JERSEY ECONOMY HARD

- According to the most recent data, New Jersey businesses have paid an extra \$1.3 billion in import taxes on products subject to Trump Administration tariffs, including \$159 million in September.
- Tariffs on China "List 3" goods accounted for \$794 million of the new taxes paid to date. New Jersey imported \$8.8 billion of "List 4" products in 2018, of which \$5.5 billion started facing additional tariffs of 15% on September 1, and the rest will face additional 15% tariffs starting December 15.
- Since the trade war began, New Jersey exports have faced \$252 million in new retaliatory tariffs from our trading partners, including \$19 million in September. These tariffs make New Jersey exports less competitive.
