Keynote Speaker: Kay Goss

Kay Goss, President of World Disaster Management, LLC, is an educator, author, historian, public servant, and emergency management professional. In 1993 she was confirmed unanimously by the U.S. Senate as the first woman to serve as associate director of the Federal Emergency Management Agency, a position she held until 2001.

While in that role, she directed the Emergency Management Institute and founded the FEMA Higher Education Program, which led to an increase in related degree programs across the country. Among her honors are inclusion in the International Network of Women in Emergency Management Hall of Fame, election to chair of the Training and Education Committee for the International Association of Emergency Managers, recognition as a Senior Fellow for the National Academy of Public Administration, specializing in emergency management and intergovernmental relations, and the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Wilbur D. Mills Treatment Center for Alcoholism.

She holds a bachelor's and master's degree in public administration/political science from the University of Arkansas.
