




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ABOUT THIS INFORMATION

The following list of VET courses has been developed to ensure school students are able to access quality VET that is appropriate and suitable within a secondary school program of learning. The VET courses have been endorsed by the South Australian Skills Commission as they are industry relevant and support skills development for the workplace.

You can access industry endorsed VET for school students two ways in 2024, either through a Flexible Industry Program (FIP) or via Stackable VET (short courses). There are also a number of courses available through a training contract outside of the Flexible Industry Program.

This document outlines the Flexible Industry Program categories and courses available in 2024, whether the courses are on- or off- the job training (or include a skills cluster), if it is recommended whether they are taken in Year 11 and/or 12, and relevant conditions for VET delivery. Unless an exemption has been approved by the Department for Education, these are the only courses that should be delivered to students enrolled in government schools as part of their secondary program.

VET courses for school students are reviewed annually. This information is correct as at 13 June 2023.






FLEXIBLE INDUSTRY PROGRAMS (FIPs)

FIPs include Certificate II and III VET qualifications that lead to entry-level employment and/or further education in key South Australian industries. FIPs enable a student to commence a VET qualification whilst at school completing their SACE and are a great option for students who want to start their career.

FIPs aim to support students into school-based apprenticeships and traineeships. They are aimed at Year 11 and 12 students, and may include customised SACE subjects and Skills Clusters to support students to develop skills for work.



STACKABLE VET

Stackable VET options are short courses delivered within a school timetable. They can provide students with prevocational skills, work preparedness, and the opportunity to try out different areas before committing to a pathway, or provide advanced skills to support students to progress through their pathway. They can be stacked with multiple options for students to explore different areas while developing their skills for work.



PRE-VOCATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS

Pre-vocational qualifications are usually delivered in year 10. They help students explore their areas of interest and the VET environment. They also develop language, literacy and numeracy skills relevant to the workplace and specific industries. Students would generally complete prevocational qualifications before commencing a FIP and could use the experience as evidence towards their VET Readiness Orientation (VETRO) requirements.


SKILLS CLUSTERS

(institutional/off-the-job delivery)

Skills Clusters comprise a cluster of accredited units of competence aligned to the requirements of industry. They support students to develop competency and skills in a particular work area and can count towards a full qualification.

They can either be:

- Pre-employment industry licensing for competencies that meet specific industry requirements (also available as a FIP)
- Introduction Skills Clusters used in a similar way to pre-vocational qualifications to help students explore the pathway and VET environment. In addition, they may provide credit transfer in Certificate level II qualifications within the FIP
- Advanced Skills Clusters for students who have completed a VET qualification and wish to continue on their selected employment pathway (also available in a FIP)
- Skill Sets nationally accredited skill sets that are recognised as suitable for school students (also available in a FIP)
