The new 9,910 square foot facility will be on 1.54 acres and will be owned and operated by the South Central Alabama Mental Health Board, Inc. in partnership with the Alabama Department of Mental Health. The new facility will provide services to forensic patients to help diagnose and treat mental health conditions. There is tremendous need for this facility to better serve our rural residents struggling with mental illness.

The school started three years ago as a tuition-free K-4 school, located in the Parelli Building in the Aspen Village "live-work-play" community. Currently, the school is adding an additional grade level each year, to become a K-8 school. The school is open to all Archuleta County families and operates year-round to better accommodate their focus on outdoor education and gardening/horticulture.

The project includes the construction of a 14-bed medical/surgical unit, a new emergency department with 10 treatment spaces, new central utilities plant and the purchase of monitoring equipment for the Emergency Department.

The new training facility will enable more water professionals to renew certifications, upgrade skills, and improve their quality of service to protect the health of Delaware communities.

The radios will improve the effective and efficient communication of the fire and public safety department.

There will also be approximately 37,000 square feet of renovations to improve/relocate a variety of existing hospital spaces, including the receiving dock, main entrance, and administration offices. The improvements will provide better patient privacy in the emergency department and better efficiencies throughout the facility.

This will replace a fire truck that is over 20 years old. The new truck will help the volunteer fire department to better serve the community and surrounding rural areas.

Project funds will help construct a 20,626 square-foot addition to the Association's existing 20-unit assisted living facility. The addition will contain 18 one-bedroom units, four two-bedroom units and renovations to the existing building, constructed in 2014, to expand the dining room and create additional office space. Project funds will also refinance approximately \$3,000,000 remaining on the existing debt. There is an increased demand in the area for the services that they provide as transitional housing from independent to assisted. The facility will be able to support an expanded staff to enhance the health and well-being of residents, as well as provide the ability to keep up with industry trends that show seniors require a lower acuity of care. This project will increase the percentage of rural residents with access to new and improved health care services.

A 6,000 square-foot building will be renovated in a community center, housing the city's public library, Chamber Office, wellness equipment, and a recreation room for public civic meetings and events. Currently, the city's library is housed in a building constructed in 1920 - one of the oldest structures in the city. The building is not disabled-compliant under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). The floor in the main room is sinking due to deteriorating floor joints, to access the front or rear entries, users must navigate stairs and there is not enough space inside the building nor on the adjacent exterior sidewalks to create a ramp. There is limited space for activities in the children's area, computer stations are in the center of the main room, which allows patrons limited privacy, and there is very little storage space available for general office and cleaning supplies. Similar limitations affect the existing Chamber of Commerce office, which consists of an 88 square-foot room shared by two employees. This project will provide access to new and improved cultural resources and address existing limitations with accessibility, energy, and construction.

The project will utilize cement to reconstruct the road, and will also expand the width of the existing roadway. This addition is necessary to accommodate the increased number of investigations due to the opioid epidemic.

Replacing the roof has been Fiddleheads top priority for the long-term stability and structural integrity of the building, as well as for the health and safety of the children and staff. Fiddlehead Center for the Arts was established in 2005 as a small 501c(3) non-profit organization to provide a variety of services (educational, developmental, aftercare, etc.) that are quality, enriching programs in the arts and sciences. This is accomplished by using creativity, discovery, and pure fun in a safe and encouraging environment that enable children to grow. The school's focuses on the arts, sciences, and cultural exploration. Since opening, Fiddlehead has touched the lives of more than 8,000 children and adults through their broad range of programs.

The 19,800 square foot building will house medical, behavioral health, care management, outreach and dental services.

Tracy Ambulance Service is a nonprofit ambulance service that was formed in 1971. The current fleet includes two 2016 ambulances and one 2009 ambulance. This project will replace the 2009 ambulance, eliminating the need for regular maintenance and provide modern, state of the art equipment. Two of the ambulances are used for patient transport and the third is used for emergency calls. All of the ambulances were purchased from the same manufacturer for the ease of moving equipment and personnel between units and having everything operate and be compatible.
MN	Amy Klobuchar, Tina Smith	Collin Peterson (07)	Clinton Community Clinic	\$3,477,000		This Rural Development investment will be used to build essential infrastructure for the Clinton Care Center. Project funds will go towards a new 20-unit assisted living facility. The Clinton Care Center is owned and operated by Clinton Community Clinic, serving residents of Clinton and surrounding communities. The existing building is a converted nursing home that was constructed in 1964 and expanded in 1975. The resident rooms are approximately 200 square feet, and each pair of two rooms share a bathroom, leaving privacy to be desired. The facility is in poor condition and needs numerous upgrades, including HVAC, commercial kitchen, plumbing system, sprinkler system, and boilers. The flooring in many areas is cracked and broken. The activity room needs an electrical upgrade and remodel. The commercial kitchen, parking lot, windows, generator, and roof all need to be replaced. The foundation on the south end is sloping and is getting worse as each year passes. The design of the existing facility is beyond its useful life and is no longer a desirable destination for prospective residents. The new facility will be approximately 23,000 square feet - featuring 405-880 square foot resident rooms, each with a private bathroom. The design will include a commercial kitchen, dining area, gathering spaces, laundry, beauty parlor, storage and more. The new building will also include a modest space that will be leased to Ortonville Area Health Services for use as a satellite clinic, eliminating long trips to the nearest clinic for residents. The new facility is hoped to attract more future residents.

Funding will help purchase a new skid steer loader machine and accompanying attachments. Blackduck Public Works Department maintains approximately 10 miles of city streets, one and one-half miles of alleyways, and six city parking lots. All of these areas need snow, sand, and debris maintenance throughout the year, which is hard to achieve with their single plow truck. This machine can be used by the city year-round and allow public works staff with the ability to more efficiently manage city maintenance of snow, sand and debris removal.

Project funds will be used to purchase a fire truck for the city of Canby Fire Department. The Canby Fire Department currently has two pumper trucks. This is standard for rural fire departments due of insurance requirements. The department protects critical infrastructure including a water treatment plant, a large hospital, and a large school. The department is also one of the larger fire departments in the area and is often called upon for mutual aid for smaller communities in the surrounding area. If there is a fire call outside the city of Canby insurance requires the department to have a second pumper truck still available for in-town service. There have been times when the city was unable to respond to calls outside Canby because the older truck, originally purchased in 1993, was out of service. The city will purchase a 2020 model pumper truck to replace the older vehicle in their current fleet.

The portable radios used by the department are at the end of their useful life and are experiencing age-related issues. Recent flooding has strained the already struggling communication system, creating more non-covered areas throughout the county. This project is critical, as it affects communications between safety personnel, the dispatching center, and the citizens of Adair County.

The motor grader will be leased to Miller Township and used to repair and maintain its roads. Excessive flooding and road damages caused extensive wear on the township's 2007 model rendering it unreliable, no longer meeting the township's needs. Township workers will use the motor grader to maintain over 150 miles of roadways.
MO	Roy Blunt, Josh Hawley	Jason Smith (08)	Caruthersville Municipal Facility Improvement Corporation	\$297,200	\$159,900	This Rural Development investment will be used to purchase equipment for the maintenance of city roads and property. Equipment includes a new dump truck and maintenance truck for the city's street department; a new radio system for its fire and law enforcement departments; self-contained breathing apparatus to replace gear near or exceeding its life expectancy, fire hoses, and bunker gear for its fire department; and body/vehicle cameras for its law enforcement department. The street department's current vehicles have multiple mechanical issues and have reached the end of their useful life. The city's many roads and ongoing subsidence issues due to proximity to the Mississippi River and high-water table require the street department to have dependable vehicles. The city's law enforcement and fire departments have 16-year-old analog digital radios. This severely restricts city personnel's ability to effectively communicate with local emergency personnel that have already switched over to the newer digital system. Cameras for officers will be an added layer of safety for the Caruthersville law enforcement department. Overall, these purchases will increase efficiency and safety throughout the city and mitigate communication issues in emergency situations, when time is of the essence.

The Hope Therapeutic Horsemanship Center, LLC. is a non-profit organization that provides therapeutic horseback riding and activities benefitting the physically and mentally disabled, elderly, veterans, and the general public. The purchase of the building it was previously renting allows the applicant to remain in its existing location and continue providing service to rural Missouri.

The current ambulance is from 2014 and has over 117,000 miles on it and continually requires extensive, and costly repairs. In addition, due to the recent flood, water covering the roads has caused additional wear on the vehicle. The new ambulance will allow for timely, reliable, delivery of emergency services; a must in protecting lives and for the prevention of suffering. The project will serve Grand River Regional Ambulance District, a service area that covers all of Gentry County and portions of Andrew, DeKalb, and Harrison counties.

The school currently has three buildings in poor condition which will be demolished. In addition to having electrical, heating and air conditioning inadequacies, they contain asbestos and lead paint, and the classroom spaces are inadequate. The new 119,000 square foot building will provide students with a safe environment with adequate learning resources and space. The new facility will include security improvements with cameras and detectors campus-wide, chain link fencing, and gates around the campus. Additional staff parking as well as parent drop-off areas will also be added. This project will provide students with access to a learning environment comparable to other school districts in North Carolina.

The squad will also be purchasing a 2020 boat motor as well as a double transport trailer. The majority of the squad's existing equipment has reached the end of its useful life, and new equipment is needed for employees to safely and effectively carry out their duties.
NC	Richard Burr, Thom Tillis	George Holding (02)	Antioch Fire Department, Incorporated (Johnston County)	\$310,000		This Rural Development investment will be used to construct a fire station for Antioch Fire Department, Inc. The department is currently housed in an existing facility which was built in 1960. This facility has had several additions and renovations over its life span. The current facility was originally constructed with a wooden frame structure having very low overhead doors and limited apparatus bay space. The low ceiling heights limits future apparatus acquisitions and cannot be raised. The proposed facility will consist of five drive thru bays, a training room, offices, a kitchen, bedrooms, and restrooms. The approximate size of the structure is 13,000 square feet. The new building will allow members of the department to carry out their duties safely and efficiently, also making future growth possible for the department. A Community Facilities loan was obligated in September 2019, additional funds have been requested to fund design modification costs.

This is a charter school that began operations in 2013. The school has expanded a grade level each year since that time and has outgrown their current space. This expansion will include the construction of a new K-6 facility that will house up to 475 students. Along with an additional 27 classrooms, the new facility will have administrative offices as well as a multipurpose room. The project also includes the construction of an athletic field that will be utilized by the main campus of the school as well as the proposed K-6 campus.

All streets are traffic ways, with several being high traffic areas. The age of the streets range from eight to 42 years. They are in poor condition with much of the pavement being broken and uneven. This resurfacing project will bring the streets from a state of failure to being in excellent condition, making travel and transport easier and safer.

The school is now in a position to purchase the facility in order to further serve the students in the local community.

The purchase of additional land will allow the organization to support more horses, thus expanding the number of sessions Hope Reins can offer to children in need.

The older trucks have high maintenance costs, and repairs on these vehicles are difficult as the parts needed are not readily available. This project will provide the department with new trucks to assist them with safely and effectively carrying out their duties to serve their community.

A portion of this corridor reflects the town's historic downtown development. This project will include modification of street cross sections, existing on-street parking will be replaced with extended sidewalks, and landscaping and decorative lighting will be added to make the corridor more pedestrian friendly. This project was originally funded in December 2018. Due to increased costs associated with project development, rerouting of electrical and phone lines, and construction administration, the town has requested this additional funding to cover the higher costs.

The streets are not adequate for projected future traffic due to the oil and gas industry. This project will help ensure the future prosperity of this community.

The new additional will also house all response apparatus and bunker gear and include a large training/community room. All trucks will have their own apparatus bay door to improve response times, eliminating the inefficiencies of moving trucks around to get them for a fire emergency call.
